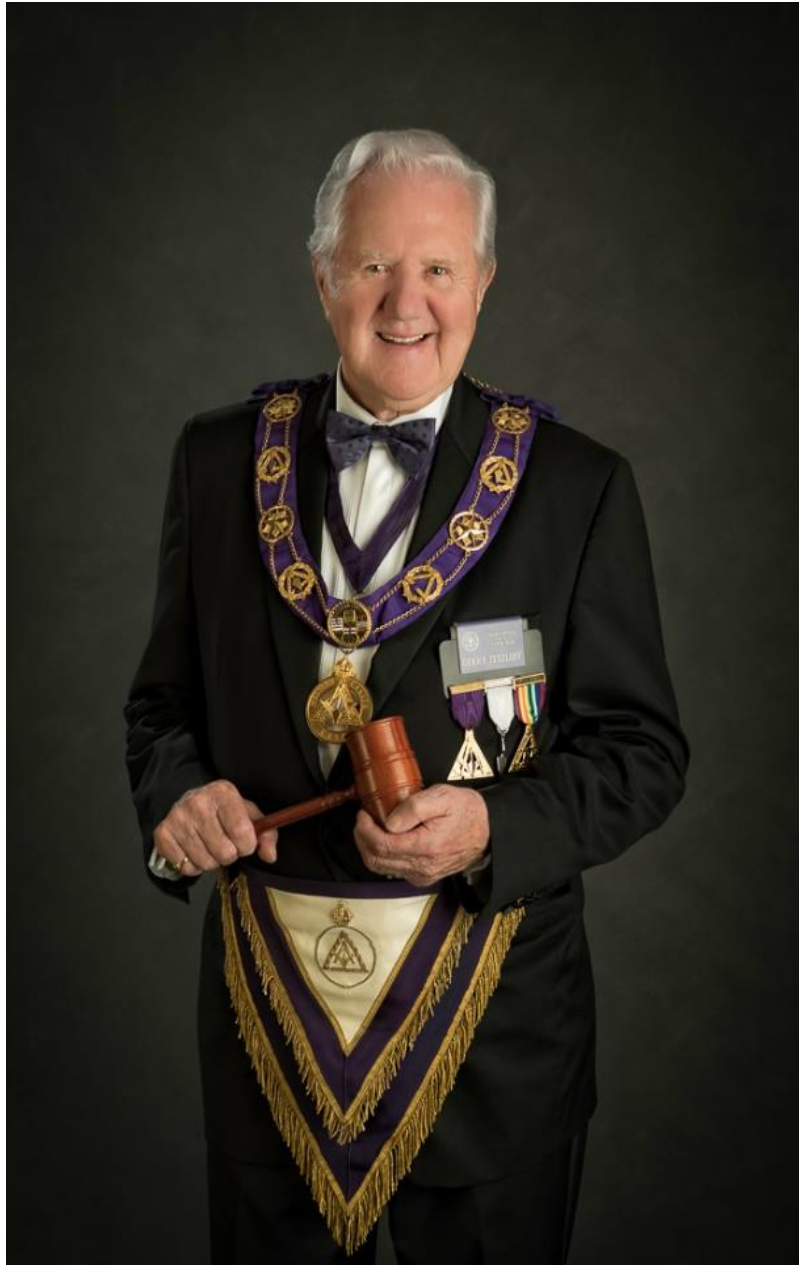

1. Manitoba District – RIC Jack Fryatt

2018 – 2019 Report of the Grand Inspector General - Manitoba

Your Grand Inspector General for Manitoba is pleased to report that there have been Official Visits to all three Manitoba Councils during 2018 - 2019; Cyrus Council in Winnipeg, Brandon Council in Brandon and Portage Council in Portage la Prairie.

All Manitoba Councils were proficient in opening and proceeded well with their work, respectively. As is common to Manitoba Masonry, fraternal and social companionship is alive and active.

Numbers, as with the rest of the various Masonic bodies, are a bit light, but there are no concerns with procedures or finances and all Manitoba Councils appear stable.

There has been a modest increase in overall membership during the past year.

The last meeting of Portage Council was a joint meeting of both the Brandon and Portage Councils in Brandon. These Councils have been experimenting with holding some of their regular Council meetings using this combined format.

Another combined meeting was held in Portage la Prairie, and, again both the Portage and Brandon Councils jointly participated.

The combined meetings appear to create participation that is more fulsome and supports interest in Cryptic Rite Masonry and the Concordant Bodies in general. I commend these Councils for taking the initiative to experiment with a different format.

As with all members of the York Rite Bodies in Manitoba, the members of all Cryptic Councils in Manitoba are upholding the best examples of men and Masons. As a whole, the York Rite Bodies have considerable interchange among the members and we are actively pursuing, through accepted and proper Masonic means, growth of the membership of all York Rite Bodies, and as noted, there have been some modest gains in membership in the Cryptic Rite.

One meeting canceled due to unavailability of sufficient members to form degree team. Much of the work is read. Most lectures delivered from memory. Only partial drama delivered for degree work. The Council seems to have some gaps in communication in organizing degrees and the Installation. The new officers are committed to remedy that.

Zohar Council #4

This is also a large urban Council with well-kept books, a good financial base with a current audit and notices distributed by both email and post. Ritual work observed as being done well with some reading occurring and good average attendance. All degree work is done with full drama.

Alberta Council #5

This is a smaller urban Council with well-kept books and records, a good financial base with a current audit and notices distributed by both email and post. Ritual work observed as being done well; some reading occurring and good average attendance for their size.

The District meeting, hosted by Alberta Council saw IC Brant Irwin elected as GIG elect and IC Kyle Burns appointed as Grand Steward for the 2019/20 term.

One of the highlights of the year for me was attending the installation of officers of Zohar Council. The work was all done from memory in exemplary fashion. It made for a very impressive ceremony.

Despite the noted shortcomings they work hard at giving a quality product. Just recently they accepted a candidate who lives in Rossland, BC. Their Council Recorder lives in

Invermere, BC which is a fair travel distance and he could be considered the back-bone to the Council.

5. BC Lower Mainland District – RIC Neil Marsh

The Councils within this District are well run with good leadership. The main concern is, that there is lack of healthy attendance. Each of Councils are maintaining their status quo with a total of 6 Companions added to the District and the loss of 5 Companions for a total gain of One. A visit was made to each of the Councils on an official capacity with additional fraternal visits and each the GIG was treated the total respect shown to that office.

This District hosted the Grand Master MIC Gerald Tetzloff on official visit. The three Councils combined their meetings into one to accomplish this fraternal visit. The Grand Master's visit greatly appreciated and he was given all the courtesies of that important office.

It was indeed a great pleasure to serve this District as their Grand Inspector General and enjoyed every moment.

VIC George Porter of Zaphon Council #8 was elected as the next Grand Inspector General for the BC Lower Mainland and VIC John Young of Zaphon Council #8 is the Grand Stewart.

6. BC Vancouver Island District – RIC Harold Hayes

It has been my privilege and pleasure to serve as Grand Inspector General for the Vancouver Island District. I take this opportunity to thank my Grand Steward, V. Ill. Comp. Rick Sheldon, for his continued support and involvement in the visitations and installations. A great travelling Companion.

Our District is comprised of three Councils, Alpha, Acme and Adoniram. They being located far enough apart as to not encroach on each other, but close enough to enjoy fraternal visits with each.

Alpha Council No.11

This Council, at present, has 30 members, with meeting attendance averaging about 13. On my Official Visit, the review of the Porch Book, as well as the Treasurer's Ledger, and the files and reports of the Recorder, were found to be in good order, as is the Council itself. They are financially stable. With some minor exceptions, the members perform their ritual well, in opening and closing as well as the Degree presentations. They currently have two candidates who will soon receive the Royal Master degree. In addition, they have a member ready to be Elevated as a Royal Ark Mariner.

Acme Council No.14.

During my official review of their various journals and records, those of the Treasurer and Recorder are up to date and in good order and condition. As well, the Council has a good financial base. Their membership is currently 24 members, with attendance averaging at 10 or so. Occasionally they encountered circumstances where they did not have a quorum to hold a meeting. They have now revised their By-laws, modifying their meeting schedule. With the new by-laws, approved by Grand Council, they changed from 10 meetings a year to 6, which still includes the required

number of meetings for their Royal Ark Mariners Lodge. These changes, with fewer meetings, hopefully will encourage better attendance, good meeting content, with planning and preparation and more importantly, attracting new members.

Adoniram Council No.15

This Council has suffered some recent setbacks. With a membership of 11 at the beginning of the year, they lost two valuable members from key positions. I found their books in some disarray as their Treasurer passed away unexpectedly and their Recorder left without giving notice. It took some time to round up the pertinent records for each Position, and now the Council members have worked on organizing the books and the Council. Their Election of Officers has shown some resolution to their earlier problems.

On a recent visit, I enjoyed their presentation of the Royal Ark Mariners Ceremony of Elevation for two Companions. Most content delivered from memory, with some reading, but that also presented well.

On the positive side, the Council has readied two candidates for the Royal Master degree.

They are a strong group of Cryptic Rite Masons, and they are not done yet.

Annual Tri-Council Meeting and Official Visit of M.I.C. Gerry Tetzloff, Grand Master.

The Vancouver Island District annual meeting was held at Morpeth Hall in Nanaimo, on Saturday, October 13, 2018. The meeting was preceded by a lunch prepared by a number of the wives and members of Adoniram Council. A repast well received and appreciated.

Following the opening of the meeting, our Grand Master, M.I.C. Gerry Tetzloff, was formally greeted and received in due form by the members of the three Councils present.

The Companions from each Council then joined to confer the S.E.M. degree on two candidates, they then being greeted as Super Excellent Masters.

The result of the election and appointment of the G.I.G. and Grand Steward for 2019-2020 were announced as T.I.C. Bruce Allan and T.I.C. Brian Beech respectively, members of Acme Council No. 14.

Following the Grand Master's closing remarks, the Councils then presented a cheque and cash donation to our Grand Master for our Cryptic Rite Charitable Foundation.

Thus, ended a fine day of fellowship and camaraderie.

REPORT RECEIVED

Report of the Grand Treasurer

We are please, to report that the Grand Council is once again showing a bank balance for the year in the positive, although you would not see that on the Receipts/Expenditures where it shows a negative of approximately \$6650.00. The main reason for this discrepancy is that the Grand Council with the approval of the Grand Assembly had changed the fiscal year to the calendar year, which now impacts the receipt of the Annual Fees for the 2018 year. Many of the Councils, if not all do not make their payments until after January 01. You may note that only \$658.00 was collected for annual fees and deposited in the 2018 year. There was \$7962.50 collected in 2019 that applies to the 2018 Annual Fees and when further examining it in relation to deficit of approximately \$6650.00, one can clearly see that we are in the black, which computes to approximately \$1310.00.

The Grand Recorder has made great strides in improving the Grand Council Officer regalia, and still has some updating to do, as can be seen by his report. Within the next couple of years, we can expect that all the regalia will be up-to-date and legal, which may change the amount budgeted for regalia.

Our current investments are gathering small amounts of interest, and we don't expect much in that for the next while. We are looking at amalgamating some of the smaller investment accounts as they mature.

All in all, we believe that the Financial picture for the Grand Council is looking as good as can be expected.

 - b. Replacement will need to be located for next year and future years.
 - c. The different District of the Grand Council are fully aware now

10. Amendments to the Constitution:

Article: Refers to the Grand Council officer's position as Grand Deputy Master.

WHEREAS: The term Deputy Grand Master has historically referred to as such, however is contrary to the Constitution.

WHEREAS: Examining other Grand Council jurisdictions' proceedings, research has found that they refer to the position as "Deputy Grand Master"

WHEREAS: Historically, the Deputy Grand Master is in fact the Deputy to the Grand Master and it only seem logical the term should be changed to "Deputy Grand Master".

THEREFORE: NOTICE OF MOTION That Article 7(a) be amended to read Deputy Grand Master

- a. It was explained that this in actual fact is a housekeeping issue with the Constitution.
- b. Technically should have 60 – 90-day notice, however this does not affect the Councils and only the Grand Council
- c. It was decided to put forth a motion for this assembly, but the motion needs to pass unanimously, if it fails it must return next year as a NOTICE OF MOTION and then dealt with at that Assembly.
- d. **MOTION: RIC Jerry W. Kopp moved and seconded by MIC Robert Turner that Article 7(a) and any further reference with the Constitutional and General Regulations be amended accordingly by changing the term "Grand Deputy Master" to "Deputy Grand Master". CARRIED at the Grand Executive meeting.**

11. Confirmation of Ranks

- a. Grand Master felt that it should be his authority to bestow or confirm the rank on the Elected Officers, ie: Grand Inspectors General.
- b. Currently there is motion being made by the almost anyone and voted on the floor of the Grand Assembly.
- c. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided that the Grand Master's Address should bestow or confirm the ranks, which everyone agreed to.
- d. There will no longer be a Motion to confer ranks, after this Assembly

12. Committee on the Grand Master's Address

- a. Question why do we continue to have a committee to examine the Grand Master's Address
- b. It was generally agreed that perhaps the Grand Master's address should be reviewed for content, etc. This committee will no submit a formal report to the Grand Assembly.

13. Combine Banquets (Grand Assembly & Grand Chapter)

- a. Suggestion was made that perhaps when these two orders follow on consecutive days that there should only be one banquet.
- b. Many variables were brought forward – pros and cons
- c. Manitoba will host this Grand Assembly in conjunction with their Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons in 2021.
- d. Grand Executive allowed Manitoba to try it on a trial basis and report its findings.

14. Deputy Grand Master announced that next year's Assembly will be in Chilliwack on the 3rd week-end in April, 2020.

15. MIC Robert Turner moved the adjournment of the meeting at 2:15 PM

Grand Master could not understand why the Constitution had Grand Deputy Master, historically the position has always been referred to Deputy Grand Master. No questions, called for the vote.

Report of the Ritual Committee

Since the last Grand Assembly, this committee under took the complete review of the Royal Ark Mariners Installation/Investiture Ritual. The review included by adding to the ritual for the investiture of the Chaplain.

The Committee has now completed the review of three rituals and these rituals will be distributed to the Council Recorders in PDF format, who will then print off copies of the rituals as required. The Officer of the Grand Recorder will only have a copy of each ritual and will no longer be source for distribution. We have found that there are many different versions of the rituals within our Councils and we hope that providing the rituals as noted we can standardize the work. This will require that the Committee on the Work and Office of the Grand Recorder distribute an amended Ritual to each Council as amendments are made. The distribution of the Rituals in this manner will only apply to the undernoted:

- a. R & SM Western Canada Installation
- b. Royal Ark Mariners Installation/Investiture
- c. Royal Ark Mariners Degree Ceremony

These rituals will not be available on the Grand Council's Website as much of the information contained is only available to Installed officers of the respective masonic bodies.

The next challenge for the Committee is to do a complete review of the Grand Council of Cryptic Rite Masons of Western Canada – Ceremony Ritual with Dramatic Interpolation, and this is a project that may take a couple of years to complete. We invite any of the Councils to provide information as to where there are glaring errors in order that the corrections can be made. We will be looking at publishing this ritual as a coil bound and if there are any objection to this we would like to hear from the Councils and at the same time receive any suggestions of a better binding system.

Report of the Grand Recorder

Most Illustrious Grand Master, distinguished East and Companions.

The Office of the Grand Recorder has had a busy year and the office has gotten busier due to, that the Grand Recorder is now the Right Excellent Grand Scribe E Pro Tem, which could change on Saturday at the Grand Chapter of the Royal Arch Masons of Alberta Grand Convocation. As many of you know RIC Marvyn Rogers, Grand Organist passed to the Grand Council Above on June 9, 2018, this of course left the Office of the Grand Scribe E vacant. MIC Rogers had been the pillar of Capitular Masonry in Alberta and will be missed. In the meantime, I was tasked to take-over the position of Grand Scribe E on a temporary basis, this could change on Saturday or I remain in office as being elected by acclamation. Some may of the opinion that the two roles cannot be handled by one individual, and I can assure you that this is not a problem. I will continue to do my best to serve both bodies to the best of my ability.

The Office of the Grand Recorder has made great efforts to update all the Grand Council Officers' Regalia. We have endeavoured to ensure that all the regalia conforms to the Grand Council Constitution and Regulations. The issue at hand was that the triangle on the Jewels and Aprons did not have the break in the proper location, which is on the left corner of the triangle when facing the triangle. The Office of the Grand Recorder has made arrangements to purchase all regalia through Canadian Masonic Supply in High River. We encourage that all Councils make their purchases through the Office of the Grand Recorder, for several reasons: **1.** Maintain the standards of the regalia and **2.** The Grand Council benefits by a small margin of profit that will help off-set the increase in the per capita fees. In speaking to the agent at Canadian Masonic Supply he finds that many members in the various concordant bodies are trying to order regalia that is not legal, for instance: Officer's Grand Council Aprons and Collar Jewel have a circle with the office emblem mounted on the circle. Members have been trying to get the Office Jewel and Apron with a Laurel Leaf which only applies to those with the rank of a Past Grand Rank. Furthermore, aprons of Past Grand Appointed officers do not have the frill around the apron perimeter. The frill is only for past elected Officers. Attached to this report you find a chart for the condition of the Grand Council Regalia, what is new, what needs to be replaced and what needs to be replaced in the future. With respect to the purchasing of Council regalia, as mentioned above, we ask that you purchase through the Office of the Grand Recorder. Arrangements have been made that the agent will receive the order from the Office of the Grand Recorder, he will fill the order when the supply is available and then forward same directly to the Council. Office of the Grand Recorder will receive the invoice from the Agent, and then the Council will be billed. The mark up on the goods will basically not exceed the retail price from the Canadian Masonic Supply, which will encourage the Councils to go through the Grand Recorder and the Grand Council can benefit from the small mark up.

An item that continues to be of concern to the Grand Council is the submission of Council summonses to the Grand Line and to the office of the Grand Recorder. There are a couple of Councils that have yet to submit a single summons. The Constitution and Regulations require that this be done.

The Grand Council has some concerns with respect to use of the Grand Website by the Councils. It is under-used by both the Grand Council and the Councils within this jurisdiction. RIC Jim Whyte the Webmaster for the Grand Council is eager to help where he can, but if he does not receive any information it is difficult for him to respond to your needs. The Office of the Grand Recorder is reviewing the forms supply and he is of the opinion that there is no need for the office to ship various forms to the Councils, when same can be made available via the Website, at no cost. You will note that there are several forms already on the Web and more are to come, so please use the Website.

The Committee on the Work and the Office of the Grand Recorder are currently examining the installation booklets for the Council and Royal Ark Mariners Lodge, along with the Ceremony of Elevation with the form of Opening and Closing in the Royal Ark Mariners Lodge. The first duty is clean up on the typing errors and formatting the rituals into a more readable document. The other change that we want to bring about is that the Office of the Grand Recorder no longer supply these three rituals, but rather that each Council would receive a PDF format copy and the Council can then reproduce the rituals as they see fit. Now, you may wonder why this direction, the Grand Council sees this as the most cost effective and time management practice. First and foremost, office storage is very limited and secondly the reproduction is very time consuming, each time the rituals are in short supply, one has to replenish the stock (Usually in small numbers). The cost of printing continues to climb upward and postage seems to follow the same trend. This will also help in that the Councils will now have the most up-to-date rituals. These rituals will not be placed on the web-site primarily due to the numbers of restricted signs, tokens and words contained therein. The Committee on the Work and the Office of the Grand Recorder will soon undertake a complete review and update of the R and S.M. Western Canada Ceremony Ritual with Dramatic Interpolations. This is a project take a couple of years or more, but be assured you will know when it is complete. We also ask that the Councils review the rituals and if you see where there is a need to correct, change or amend any portion to please let the Office of the Grand Recorder know. Remember this is your ritual and it has to be workable.

The Grand Recorder has accompanied the Grand Master – MIC Gerald Tetzloff on two visits out of province. One visit to Revelstoke where they had joint meeting with Cascade Council #18 and Zenith Council #16. The second trip was to icy, snowy, rainy and foggy City of Regina, Saskatchewan, where we attended the installation of the Saskatchewan Council #6. Both visits the GM and myself were well received and we thank the many courtesies shown by the Councils.

MOTION I, REC Jerry W. Kopp move, seconded by RIC Terry Gould that Article 7(a) be amended by inserting a new Grand Officers position that of **Grand Registrar** immediately after the Grand Recorder's Position. **CARRIED**
